Attendees will have the opportunity to attend peer-moderated round tables on two of the below topics.

- **Engaging Outside Organizations** - Discuss various ways to engage outside partners in research including schools, community organizations, health departments and parents.
- **Translating research into policy** – Utilizing research findings in policy development. Overcoming barriers of translating research into program
